Welcome

Vice Chairperson Amy Ehresman called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. and welcomed Council members, staff, and guests.

Approval of Minutes

Vice Chairperson Amy Ehresman asked for approval of the September 12, 2022, Membership Council Meeting minutes.

- Mr. Larry Millward asked how much pressure the Retirement System has received regarding ESG issues. Mr. Dan Andersen explained the ESG issues and URS' fiduciary duty to make investments in the best interest of the beneficiaries. He reported that URS has not had much pressure from stakeholders or the legislature on ESG issues.
- Mr. LeGrand Bitter stated that they are watching potential firefighter and public safety legislation.

2023 Legislation Update

Mr. Dee Larsen and Mr. Kory Cox reviewed potential retirement benefit changes and preliminary cost estimates that were discussed in last week's meeting with stakeholders.

- Public Employees System
 - Increase Tier 2 PE Hybrid Plan multiplier from 1.5% to 1.72% for all years of Tier 2 service
 - No working retirees changes for Public Employees system
 - Postretirement reemployment restriction changes for Public Employees that are financed through a working retiree surcharge

- Employer supplemental contributions
- One-time money may be used to help finance retirement benefits or benefit changes
- Public Safety and Firefighter Systems
 - Increase the Tier 2 Public Safety and Firefighters system multiplier to 2.0% for years of service prior to July 1, 2022 (Retroactively increase the gap time)
 - New Exception to the Postretirement Reemployment Restrictions (3.5year window)
 - Other PS/FF systems discussion points
 - One-time money may be used to help finance retirement benefits or benefit changes
